I send greetings to you in the wonderful name of Jesus Christ our Lord, the Head of the Body, the Church. This is a powerful chapter for the ministry today, to keep us reminded of our calling, and the importance of our calling. This should behoove us to be before our Lord on our knees seeking Him for that Holy Ghost anointing, and that inspiration to minister the powerful Word of God.

"For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart" (Heb. 4:12).

I want to encourage all who are called into the ministry to be working and ministering. There are Rest Homes, Hospitals, Home prayer meetings and other various ways we can be working for the Lord and His Church. "On October 20, 1941 at 11:50 a.m., the Church of Prophecy Marker Association was accepted by The Church of God as an auxiliary by unanimous agreement as recommended by the Questions and Subjects committee. Its purpose was to locate, mark, beautify, and maintain places of Biblical interest and other prominent places in the world in connection with the Church of God of the Bible. Further developments in the auxiliary would be worked out later."

CPMA is the auxiliary that specializes in keeping the vision of the Church clear and alive in the minds and hearts of all our members, while also encouraging each member to be "living markers" for

Jesus Christ and His Church as described in the Bible. In our CPMA services, we should concentrate on establishing our people in the doctrine of the Church and making the vision plain." (thoughts from the CPMA Leaders Handbook) Part of the doctrine of the Church is the "Body of Christ" (one body for all of the children of God who accept Jesus Christ as their Saviour). The Church of God is that one Body; she is the "Bride of Christ."

"My dove, my undefiled is but one; she is the only one of her mother, she is the choice one of her that bare her. The daughters saw her, and blessed her; yea, the queens and the concubines, and they praised her. Who is she that looketh forth as the morning, fair as the moon, clear as the sun, and terrible as an army with banners?" (Song of Solomon 6:9).

In Song of Solomon 6:9, 10, we find a wonderful analogy of the Church and her beauty. Do you see her? She's beautiful. Everything about her is beautiful. Her doctrine is pure. Her doctrine is none other than the whole Bible (God's Word) rightly divided. She doesn't have man-made laws or doctrine, but her doctrine is God's Word and nothing else; in that she is undefiled. It's the enemy's job to keep our focus where he wants it, so that he can lead us to destruction. All too frequently, we miss out on God's blessings, because we're not focused on what's important. We may recognize the good but fail to

understand the source and fail to give God the glory.

Sometimes we are blinded to the hints from God to go a certain direction because of our own desires. We know what we want for ourselves, assume it's God's will and then blame any difficulties on the enemy, when they are often a result of our own choices. We can't choose our own path and expect God to bless it. We must find God's will. I heard a quote one time: "God, make me a part of what you're blessing."

Jesus tells us that in this world ye shall have tribulation. Not only His followers, not only the lost, but everyone in this world. It is our responsibility to seek out the source of every trial we face. Some are from God in order to strengthen us. Some are from the enemy in order to hinder us. And some may be for the benefit of others.

If we have gone off course, we would do well to find God's will and return to it. If we are in God's will, we must persevere through it. Any other action on our part will only hinder us and those around us. It is certain that, just as Jesus, we must be about the Father's business. But the enemy has plenty of non-sinful activities that can steal our time from the Lord's work. We can become so engaged in our work that we forget who it was that assigned the task (Even work for the Church).

It is critical that we spend time each day asking the Lord to guide our efforts, while He helps us to recognize the busy-work that the enemy tries to slip into our lives, hoping we'll think it's from God. Is God first in our list of priorities? Does He have to plead with us in order for us to spend time in His Word, in our prayer closets, in His service? We WILL do whatever is important to us. If we come to the end of the day and have not spent time with God somehow and try to squeeze in a few minutes of prayer or Bible reading; whatever it was that kept us busy during the day, THAT is what was important to us; by biblical accounts, it has become our god. If all idols are not removed, our hearts will be divided, we will remain unclean, and we cannot please God in this condition.

How often do we mistake God's mercy toward us as reward for our own perceived faithful service? We would do well to search out our own shortcomings and seek God's face, before considering our lives well lived examples of faithfulness ... and then falling short in the end. Sometimes we see God's work in our lives as blessings, when, in fact, they are the outpouring of His mercy on His wayward children. Sometimes God will send His mercy to us in hopes of directing our attention back to Him as the source of all good things. If our spiritual eyes are not open, we will miss out on His eternal blessings, by and by.

We occasionally will cleave to the very thing in our lives that is hindering us, believing it to be God's will. In doing so, we greatly disrespect the mercy and grace that God made available through the death of His Son. We rarely see this while it is taking place, but our hindsight is far clearer than our foresight when dealing with subtly of the enemy's tactics.

If we see that we have separated ourselves from God, we would do well to respond quickly. We must quickly recognize the shortcomings in our own lives, and in our families, then help them to prepare themselves to seek the Lord. If

we are not wholly dedicated to God, He is under no obligation to bless us.

As servants of God, we cannot allow our status as children of the King make us feel High and lifted up. We may not be perfect yet, but if our desire is always to please God and find his favor, we will be found faithful in the end.
